# From the Curate

'Tell me, what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?'

Mary Oliver's poem, *The Summer Day*, bursts with awe and wonder at the natural world. 'Who made the world?', she asks; 'Who made the swan, and the black bear? / Who made the grasshopper?'. It's a hymn of praise that each of us senses bubbling up inside us when we contemplate the sheer overflow of *being* in all that surrounds us and opens itself to our delight. Yet the poem is marked with ambiguity, too: 'Doesn't everything die at last, and too soon?', Oliver wonders, as she also admits, 'I don't know exactly what a prayer is.'

It might at first seem that the Christian celebration of Easter is cut from a very different cloth. After all, isn't belief in Christ's Resurrection – and ours – all about the claim that we have *more* than one 'wild and precious life'? Oughtn't it to do away with grief and uncertainty altogether? Sometimes that's the way our Easter hymns can be heard.

Yet I think the truth lies in ambiguity. The Resurrection of Christ does not remove the reality of death; it changes how we live with it. 'O death, where is thy sting?', taunts St Paul (1 Cor. 15.55), but not because death won't happen. Rather, Christ's Resurrection tells us that death has lost the power to shape and define us. No longer will our lives be claimed by the fear of death, distorted into selfishness by mortal peril. For what Christ's bursting forth from the tomb shows is what lies at the fount of all being: a plenitude of unending love, which will let nothing good fall away.

The Resurrection of Christ turns us, not away from the world, but more radically *towards* it, because it shows us that all the world comes truly alive when our wild and precious lives are opened to the unending, undying Love which is their true source. 'I don't know exactly what a prayer is', says Oliver, 'but I do know how to pay attention'. And that is a worthy beginning: to attend to the world, and see everywhere an infinite grace which, breathing through all our entrapments and griefs, sets us free to live.

May you know such life, this Eastertide and always.



With the coronation of King Charles III in May, it is coincidental that our first four events of 2023 have some, albeit tenuous connections, with this event.

A coronation is both the symbolic religious ceremony during which a sovereign is crowned as well as the physical act of placing a crown on a monarch's head and formalises the monarch's role as the Head of the Church of England. After a fascinating presentation by Maria Jordan in February about the very different textiles of past monarchs, we joined Pauline Simpson on her beautifully illustrated Pilgrimage to the Holy Land through her presentation last month.

Coming up this month on Wednesday 19th April, 7.30pm, at Neatishead School, Ian Hinton, from Norfolk Historic Buildings Group, will take us on a journey around many of the medieval churches in the Broadland area focusing on architectural changes over the years to church buildings. All welcome, NIBCHG Friends free, visitors £3. Then May will see us visiting The Rosary Cemetery in Norwich (more details in May NIB), the first nondenominational cemetery in the UK which opened in 1820 and where some notable Norfolk people are buried. These include Edward Boardman (How Hill), Jeremiah Colman (Colman's Mustard), Richard Hanbury Gurney (Barclays Bank) and the Revd John Gunn who was born at Irstead (1801-1890). The Revd Gunn was vicar of Irstead and Barton Turf from 1829 to 1869 and a memorial to him can be found in Irstead Church.

# Wildlife Notes

March has been much wetter than February in terms of rainfall, but it has still been a quiet month on the broad for wintering wildfowl apart from the ever-present Goldeneye ducks. In contrast the Trinity broads (Ormesby, Rollesby etc) have held both Ring-Necked and Ferruginous ducks as well

as Smew through most of the winter months. I have seen all three species on Barton Broad in the past but so far not this winter. Ring-Necked duck are also known as Ring-Billed duck and are similar in size and appearance to our familiar Tufted duck although they lack the distinctive tuft of feathers at the back of the head. The main distinguishing feature is a band of white colour horizontally across the beak just after the black tip and some white colour at the base of the beak around the face.

Recently I heard of a pair of ravens which had been seen around the area of Hoveton Hall for about a week but sadly they appear to have moved on. I wrote previously how Ravens are spreading across East Anglia and are now breeding in both Norfolk and Suffolk so listen out for their distinctive "Gronk, Gronk" calls.

April is the month when we can look forward to many of our summer visitors returning so look out for your first Sand Martins, Swallows and House Martins usually in that order and then Swifts right at the end of the month.

As I write this in mid-March, I have already heard the first singing Chiffchaff (on the 18<sup>th</sup>) and look forward to Blackcaps, Whitethroats and Willow Warblers turning up in the next few weeks. One of the joys of migration time in April and May





is that you never know what may turn up and I look forward to hearing about some of your

interesting sightings just as I have done recently with reports of Fieldfares and Redwings passing through. Another of the delights of spring is of course the dawn chorus and now is the time to get up early and just get out and stand and listen to the woodland birds singing. Will you be the first to hear the Cuckoo, see the first Ring Ouzel on a patch of grass or observe Black Terns passing through on the broad? Warm days in April will

bring out our first spring species of butterfly with Brimstone, Orange Tip and Speckled Wood on the wing as well as the first Large Red Damselflies and Hairy Dragonflies. Now that Barton Common ponds have been dug out and filled with water we are expecting to see more species of dragonfly there.





# **Neatishead Parish Council**

Council Elections: 2023 is a year for our local elections (including all District, Town and Parish councils). All sitting councillors must stand down and re-apply for their position alongside any new applicants interested in joining the council. If there are more suitable applicants than seats (7 for Neatishead PC), a poll will take place on 4th May 2023, where local parishioners can vote on who they want on the council. If there are 7 or fewer suitable applicants, the elections will be noncontested.

If interested in becoming a councillor for Neatishead please contact neatishead.parish@gmail.com for details, or contact one of the current councillors who would be very happy to explain what a rewarding and fulfilling role it is.

**Voting**. Under the Elections Act 2022, voters will be required to show photographic ID, see right for more details, including how to get a Voter Authority Certificate if you don't have an accepted form of photo ID and how to apply for a postal vote.

Precept 2023-24. The council would like to take this opportunity to explain the increase in the precept from last year, as at around 16% (£6.15 per household). It feels like another unwanted cost of living increase. As you can appreciate, there was minimal maintenance work in the village over the pandemic and 2022-23 saw a spend of nearly £7K (up from £3.7K in 2021-22) to catch up. This essential work included dredging the ditch at the recreation ground; re-laying the path leading up to the New Victory Hall; repairing damaged facilities at the park and recreation ground; cutting back overgrown vegetation; attending to storm damaged trees and replacing posts and fencing at the staithe. As a result, reserve funds have fallen below the recommended levels. This, together with a large historic unpaid solicitor's bill and increases in day to day running costs means that the 2022-23 precept was insufficient to enable the council to deliver the required services. The decision was not taken easily and full consideration was given to the impact on the local community, but it was unavoidable. The council operates an open and transparent approach and this increase was discussed at the parish council monthly meetings and detailed in the minutes. A full copy of the minutes and the budget is available on Neatishead Parish Council website.

**Neatishead Staithe**: The current works at the staithe are due to be finished by Easter and the Broads Authority has given its assurance that the grounds will be left neat and tidy.

**Bridge closure**: Works to repair the damaged bridge at The Street are due between **15**<sup>th</sup> to the **26**<sup>th</sup> **May 2023**. The road will be closed to vehicles but pedestrians will be able to cross.

Road closure notices: the parish council routinely receives road closure notices for the area. Where councillors consider these to be particularly relevant for Neatishead parishioners, the notices will be posted on the NPC website, Facebook page and notice boards.

# Local Parish Elections 2023 – and new ID Requirements for voters

Local elections will be held this year for all District, Town and Parish councils. Sitting councillors must stand down and re-apply for their position and new suitable applicants can apply. Applications must be completed and returned by hand to North Norfolk District Council, Holt Road, Cromer.

A poll will take place on 4<sup>th</sup> May 2023 if there are more suitable applicants than seats (7 for Neatishead PC; 7 for Barton & Irstead PC). Under the Elections Act 2022, if the seats are contested and a poll is held, voters will need photographic ID which can be:

- a Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or Commonwealth country.
- a Driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or an EEA state.

or one of the following: a biometric immigration document, an identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card), a Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card), a Blue Badge, a national identity card issued by an EEA state, an older person's bus pass, a disabled person's bus pass, an Oyster 60+ Card, a Freedom Pass, a Scottish National Entitlement Card issued in Scotland, a 60 and over Welsh Concessionary Travel Card issued in Wales, a disabled person's Welsh Concessionary Travel Card issued in Wales, a Senior SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland, a Registered Blind SmartPass or Blind Person's SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland, a War Disablement SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland, a 60+ SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland, a Half Fare SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland, an Electoral Identity Card issued in Northern Ireland.

If you do not have one of these, you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate from the UK Government website. This can be the online portal or completing an application form in writing and hand delivering or posting to Electoral Services, North Norfolk District Council, Holt Road, Cromer. The deadline for applications is 5pm on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2023.

You can also apply for a postal vote where you are not required to provide photographic ID but this must be completed by 5pm on 18<sup>th</sup> April 2023.




